Tools for Success...In school... and life!

Dr. Sharon Kovalevsky from our Dublin School District Pathways Program would like to invite you to the John Green MPR on Thursday, August 21st, at 5:30 pm for a Destination Imagination information night.

Destination Imagination® (DI) is an outside-of-school, project-based educational program that inspires and equips students to become the next generation of innovators and leaders. Teams in our program improve in creative thinking, critical thinking and collaborative problem solving. Our participants experience the creative process, develop new friendships and learn to work together.

Who: Students in grades kindergarten through university can participate, with up to seven members per team. Each team needs an adult Team Manager who helps students stay on track but does not directly help the team develop their solution to the DI Challenge. Team Managers are typically parents or other volunteers.

What: There are seven new DI Challenges each year which are developed by a team of educators and industry experts with emphasis on 21st Century Learning Skills, STEM, Common Core and the Arts. The areas of focus include: Technical, Scientific, Fine Arts, Improvisational, Structural and Service Learning. There is also a non-competitive Early Learning Challenge that allows kids in kindergarten, first and second grade to build social and problem solving skills. Each team also practices and competes in an Instant Challenge. These are quick thinking, creative challenges that usually take between five and ten minutes to solve and present.

Where: Team meetings take place at a time and place agreed upon by the team. Our local regional tournament takes place early March in the Tri-Valley area.

When: Each season takes place from September through mid-February, or into May depending on how far the team progresses. Teams typically meet weekly for an hour or two and can spend 4 to 6 months developing and practicing their DI Challenge solutions.

Why: Students in our program develop depth in creative thinking, critical thinking, and collaborative problem solving. Our kids experience the creative process, develop new friendships, and most importantly, have fun!
